The Reunite Foundation is a "Non-Profit" that offers advice, support and information when reuniting families and tracing relatives with whom contact has been lost over the years. Family members may lose touch for any number of reasons; perhaps a relative has moved away and has lost touch or a family quarrel that has never reconciled.

Our Mission

Our mission is to advise, assist and support local hospital Patient Advice and Liaison Service (PALS), hospital admissions departments, local authorities, residential care homes, carers or social workers when trying to locate missing relatives and next of kin for any number of reasons. This support is crucial in cases where someone has been admitted to hospital and has no next of kin or no known family. Alternatively, it may be a local authority, social worker or carer who has concerns for the welfare of a particular individual.

Our Vision

Our vision is to make a meaningful contribution to the lives of those people who have lost touch with their families and now need them most.

Missing Relatives

Our resourceful volunteers work tirelessly to locate and reunite families using public databases and outside organisations such as the Red Cross and the Salvation Army. At all stages of the process, we provide updates on progress and leads. Many of our committed volunteers are also work outside usual office hours.

Next of Kin

Tracing next of kin may not necessarily be family or relatives. In such cases, we advise, assist and support local hospital Patient Advice and Liaison Service (PALS), hospital admissions departments, local authorities, residential care homes, carers or social workers to locate next of kin for any number of reasons. We use the same databases and outside organisations to assist with such searches.

Helping the Homeless

Homeless people are in every city and town in the UK; most have family somewhere. Our homelessness programme put volunteers on the ground to help reunite homeless people with their families in the hope they do not have to live on the streets any longer.

Appropriate Adult

One of the most crucial issues in recent years that is overlooked by many agencies such as the DWP and the Police is the necessity for an "Appropriate Adult" to be present at interviews, appointment and assessments. An appropriate adult can also assist with filling in complicated forms such as Pension and PIP.
